

Arjumand Painting Award

A few years back, during a visit to Australia for my solo exhibition, I got the opportunity to attend the impressive Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes Exhibition in Sydney. These national awards are given for different genres of paintings to Australian painters. My impression was that if Pakistani painters were allowed to compete, they would have bagged several prizes. This created the desire that Pakistan should also have a regular prestigious painting award.

In the absence of patronage by the government, gallery 6 decided to launch the "Arjumand Painting Award" – the first ever art award by any private gallery in Pakistan. This has been instituted to fill the void to regularly appreciate and recognize outstanding painters.

The key purpose of the Award is to emphasize the importance of classical painting among new, emerging and recently established artists. Our conviction is that the Award will generate or maintain interest in the classical art form of painting, as it is dwindling away with the increasing use of computers and other technologies in art. We at gallery 6 firmly believe that whatever may be the concept of a painting, the skill with which it is composed and painted ascertains its standard.

We also had a concern that besides those artists who have succeeded in attaining recognition, there are likely to be other talented painters across Pakistan who are struggling to get merited appreciation. They may belong to areas where there are no galleries or they may have not yet been spotted by the gallery curators of the three cities (Islamabad, Karachi and Lahore) that mostly manage art promotion in Pakistan. Hence, this competition will also provide an opportunity to these artists to show case their paintings with well-known names.

We are very privileged that five eminent artists/art critics of our country professionally guided us in ascertaining the eligibility, requirements, process and criteria for judgement of the Award. They are the judges of the first award and we are grateful to them for sharing our vision and assisting us voluntarily over the last several months.

Participants will be happy to learn that the judgement for the Award is a 3-step process. Each judge will score independently without interacting with any other judge, hence, avoiding peer influence and maintaining transparency. The selection will be based on the defined criteria of Concept, Creativity, Execution and Composition – the key elements of a quality painting.

I am very delighted to state that response to the 2015 Award is overwhelming and we are poised to present several artists of high calibre with skilful painterly qualities deserving worldwide recognition.

In 2008, I met Dr. Arjumand Faisel in Karachi. Besides exchange of ideas, he mentioned that he was planning to open a commercial art gallery. I was somewhat apprehensive and asked Dr. Faisel to think again as there are many challenges in running a gallery. A common friend of ours expressed the same feelings when I brought up the subject. Obviously, Dr. Faisel proved both of us wrong and successfully opened an art gallery with the name of Gallery 6 in Islamabad.

Dr. Faisel had initially expressed some difficulty in handling the artists with a temperament. However through his patience and perseverance, he succeeded and was able to offer many exceptional exhibits at gallery 6, which is now one of the most active and leading galleries in Pakistan. He took his efforts beyond the borders and introduced Pakistani artists overseas. In 2008, Dr. Faisel, through his personal effort and outreach, took an exhibition of Pakistani artists to Hawaii which was extensively covered by the press. Later gallery 6 arranged exhibition of Pakistani artists in India and Australia.

The Arjumand Award is yet another milestone achieved by gallery 6 and a notable contribution to the development of art in Pakistan. The need of such an award is particularly important in the absence of any such program by the institutions set up by the government to promote art in Pakistan. The Arjumand Award is a monumental undertaking will bring new talent to limelight and contribute a great deal to the development of Pakistani art.

In recent years, the race to imitate the West has put the "Realism" or conventional art at the back seat. It is high time that an idea emerged to encourage the outcast breed of the artists who follow classical genre. It is time to prove that realism can just be as modern and avant-garde as any other form of expression. If art is all about freedom of expression then let those who practice and proselytize realism have some freedom too.

I congratulate Dr. Arjumand Faisel and gallery 6 for introducing Arjumand Award. I hope that the young artists will take full advantage of this rare opportunity.

Art in Pakistan today is a diverse, vibrant phenomenon, rapidly expanding and acknowledged by way of exhibitions in international art circles. One must appreciate the role that art galleries have played in the promotion and encouragement of art in Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad since the first commercial art gallery was opened in the country by Bashir Mirza in 1965, and firmly established by S.Ali Imam in 1971. A Pakistan National Council of the Arts was established in the 70s, but it is evident that it is the galleries that are promoting the superb work of country's artists nationally and internationally.

One has followed with interest the activities of Islamabad's gallery 6, an active and lively centre of art that emerged from the great interest and love of art of Dr. Arjumand Faisel. One has known him through the years as the artist who in 2008, opened gallery 6. Since then he has curated and mounted about seventy diverse and successful exhibitions in the gallery and has contributed to worldwide events online.

The latest project underway from gallery 6, is the establishment of a National Painting Award, since it is evident the encouragement of art and artists must come from the private sector. This award, Dr. Faisel explained, is aimed to stimulate artists to paint and preserve the classic traditions of art using brush and paint. By last date for submissions, a large number of entries arrived from throughout the country. The judges, who are anonymous, will have a hard task in selecting the National Award Winner from the exciting body of work received; part of an on-going exciting art movement in the country.

The visual arts in Pakistan are thriving, and that's a surprise to a lot of outsiders. The image of Pakistan abroad is rarely a nuanced one. When I laud the Pak art scene, I'm often met with a curious skepticism. I tell them, "Pechida hai," the Urdu phrase that loosely translates as, "It's complicated."

Which is why Dr. Arjumand Faisel's initiative is so important. The story about the sheer variety of Pakistani contemporary art just doesn't get enough play outside Pakistan. But a generation of living artists is creating work that is often cutting-edge, daring, and unflinching in its frank criticisms of domestic excesses.

Dr. Faisel, always tireless in his support of the most unusual and ruthlessly honest art, has outdone even himself in founding and funding the Arjumand Painting Award, a national painting prize. The goal is to bolster an already thriving art scene. What can we say of Dr. Faisel? Bravo, thank you, you inspire me as doubtless this award will inspire a generation of young, up-and-coming visual artists.

Judges



Aasim Akhtar is an independent artist, art critic and curator. His writing is published in magazines, catalogues, and books both nationally and internationally, and his art work has been widely exhibited, more recently at Whitechapel Gallery, London, as part of a commemorative show entitled, Where Three Dreams Cross: 150 Years of Photography in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh (2010). He was a curator-in-residence at the Fukuoka Asian Art Museum in Japan in 2002. He is the author of two published books, Regards Croises (Alliance Francaise, Islamabad, 1996) and The Distant Steppe (Alliance Francaise, Islamabad, 1997), and has just finished writing his third, Dialogues with Threads: Traditions of Embroidery in Hazara. He teaches Art Appreciation and Studio Practice at The National College of Arts, Rawalpindi.



Akram Dost graduated in 1983 from NCA, Lahore. Over years, his continued success and progress with different mediums in art has made him an iconic figure in Balochistan and a prominent artist in Pakistan. He is currently working as the Chairperson, Department of Fine Arts, University of Balochistan, Quetta. Akram has to his credit 19 solo exhibitions in Pakistan and one in France; and several group shows in Bangladesh, Canada, France, India, Japan, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Syria and UAE. He has attended art residency in China and conducted an art workshop in Thailand. For his services to art, he was decorated with the President's Pride of Performance Award in 2004.



Meher Afroz graduated in Fine Arts from Government College of Arts and Crafts, Lucknow, in 1971. She has been an art teacher since 1975, when she joined Central Institute of Arts and Crafts, Karachi, as Lecturer and is currently a visiting Professor at the Indus Valley School of Art and Architecture. She is a very well-known painter and has held 20 solo exhibitions in Pakistan, Sri Lanka and UK; participated in 31 regional and international exhibitions in Bangladesh, Canada, Hong Kong, India, Iraq, Jordan, Pakistan, UAE, UK and USA; and in 26 group shows in Pakistan. For her outstanding services to art, she was recently decorated with the President's Pride of Performance Award in 2015.



RM Naeem is Assistant Professor at NCA, Lahore, which is also his alma mater. Since his graduation in 1993, he has held sixteen solo shows both in Pakistan and abroad. In addition, his work has been exhibited internationally in several countries: Australia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Canada, China, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Korea, Malaysia, Norway, Oman, Singapore, Sri Lanka, UAE, UK and USA. Naeem has attended 17 various art camps and residencies abroad and has also conducted various art-counselling workshops. Since 1994, he is promoting art through art education at STUDIO RM, which also initiated the Studio RM (International) Residency program in Lahore, in 2008. His work has garnered several scholarships, awards and prizes.



Sana Arjumand graduated from NCA, Lahore, in 2005 and has worked as a faculty member of NCA (Rawalpindi). She has several exhibitions to her credit. Besides art galleries in Islamabad, Karachi and Lahore, her work has been displayed across the globe in solo and group exhibitions in art galleries, museums, Art Fairs, and in art institutions in Australia, Hong Kong, India, Jordan, Korea, UAE, UK and USA. She has been part of residencies such as Art Omi in New York and RM Studio in Lahore. "Art Info" nominated her as one of the top ten rising stars in Pakistan and India and several international magazines have reviewed her work with outstanding accolades.


























